 Describes experience in utilizing data for quality improvement activities.
3. Partnerships  
 Adequately describes how coordination between the two Clinical Coordinating Centers and ODH Coverdell Registry staff will be maintained.  
 Describes processes used to support participating Registry hospitals related to enrollment in GWTG-Stroke and the coordination of quality improvement activities.
4. Implementation Plan  
 Describes major steps proposed to implement and operate Clinical Coordinating Center Registry activities.
5. Methodology  
 Provides a relevant and realistic work plan with impact and process objectives focused on systems and policy approaches.  
 Provides strategies that use Registry data to improve acute stroke care.  
 Includes and evaluation plan that identifies evaluation questions and indicators for each work plan objective, describes when and how data will be collected and analyzed, indicates who is responsible, and describes how results will be used and disseminated.
6. Budget  
 Narrative is satisfactory and relates expenditures to Work Plan.  
 Staff identified and appropriate to program scope of work.  
 Budget is reasonable and adequate to meet the goals and objective of the project.
