Provide radon awareness training to real estate personnel. Maintain an Ohio radon information website and database.

REMARKS:

All federal funding to initiative #1 subgrantees has been reduced due to federal funding limitations.

Specifically:

1. Carroll County General Health District federal funding has been reduced by a total of \$22,060.00 -- \$20,824.00 to reflect a 60/40 federal/state match plus \$1,236.00. A) Reduce Personnel Budget category to \$36,338.09 and, B) Reduce Other Costs category to \$14,485.91.
2. Public Health-Dayton & Montgomery County federal funding has been reduced by \$21,390.00 to reflect a 60/40 federal/state match. A) Reduce Other Costs category to \$17,085.00.
3. Seneca County Health Department federal funding has been reduced by \$27,028.00. A) Reduce Other Costs category to \$5,122.53 and B) Reduce Contracts category to \$34,934.64.
4. Licking County Health Department federal funding has been reduced 11,056.55. A) Reduce Other Costs category to \$5,900.00 and B) Reduce Contracts category to \$13,795.45.
