Establish a mutually agreeable method for Ohio's poison control centers to share electronically with state and local public health near real-time poison center data relevant to rapid detection and characterization of chemical, biological, radiological or nuclear "events";

Establish a mutually agreeable list of priority health conditions and syndromes for rapid reporting to state and local public;

Develop protocols and points of contact for reporting and investigating reports of priority health conditions and syndromes;

Plan to provide surge capacity in the event of a chemical, biological, radiological or nuclear threat or exposure; and

Expand existing telecommunication equipment to enhance the available number of workstations at each regional poison control center.
