Conduct operational programs for the identification, case management and prevention of sexually transmitted diseases through Disease Intervention Specialist Partner Services (DISPS), Syphilis Elimination Effort (SEE) and the Gonococcal Isolate Surveillance Project (GISP).</li> <li>2. Prevention and control of sexually transmitted diseases through community and individual behavior change, medical and laboratory services, partner services, leadership and program management, surveillance and data management, training and professional development and program evaluation.</li> <li>3. Prevention of STD-related HIV transmission and acquisition and other STD-HIV interactions by decreasing bacterial STDs, increasing HIV screening among those with STDs and those with behavioral risks and ensuring routine STD screening among HIV infected persons.</li> </ol>



**REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:**

Applications were evaluated whether the January-June 2008 progress report was addressed; summarization of the agency's structure as how it relates to the program and how the program will be managed; provided data pertaining to DISPS activities, morbidity trends, regional coverage and discussion of DIS staff supervision problems or needs for the first six months of 2008 and data pertaining to SEE activities and morbidity trends for the first six months of 2008 and provide an improvement plan for 2009. Application should indicate if local health district has met the performance measures or not met the measures and for all "not met" provide an improvement plan; describe the implementation process for the Social Networking Project; explanation of how a minimum of 30% of the SEE grant funds are directly provided to the community based organizations; address activities/events for STD Awareness Month. Due to funding recessions and \$80,624 going directly to the Cleveland Clinic Foundation, funds were decreased \$98,762 from last year's award.

**REMARKS:**

Federal Funding: \$773,460

The focus of the reduction was to maintain DIS Staff in all local jurisdictions. Although Dayton-Montgomery Health District received funds authorized in the 2009 RFP, the award will result in a potential reduction in a DIS position. Program plans to review funding in the second quarter and possibly make adjustments to maintain the current DIS staffing in the Dayton-Montgomery region.
