OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

The goal of the IAP program is to achieve and maintain 90% vaccination coverage levels for universally recommended vaccines among children less than 24 months of age through:

- Assessing and improving health district immunization rates through use of local Immunization Information System (IIS)
- Assessing and improving the immunization rates of providers throughout the applicant county (or counties)
- Increasing the percentage of children participating in the state or local Immunization Information System (IIS)
- Identifying geographic pockets of low immunization levels and providing additional immunization education to parents and health care providers in those areas
- Educating immunization providers and other providers who provide primary care to children
- Collaborating with WIC
- Implementing additional and targeted reminder and recall activities to improve local health department immunization rates.

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

The 2010 Immunization Action Plan grant application is a competitive grant application beginning January 1, 2010 and ending December 31, 2010. The ODH GMIS 2.0 system showed 38 accounts set up for applications - 38 completed IAP grant applications were received and reviewed. Of those submitted, 15 IAP applications represent multi-county partnerships with a total of 56 counties participating in the grant.

According to the 2010 IAP RFP, awards will be based upon all of the following criteria:

1. The resident birth cohort of children in the applicant county;
2. The number of children served by vaccines at each health department;
3. The number of VFC providers in each applicant county;
4. The ability of applicants to meet stated program objectives in 2008 and 2009 (if applicable);
5. The soundness and score of applicant responses to requirements for 2010.

All 2010 IAP applications were scored by two independent reviewers from the Immunization Program workforce. The average IAP application score for 2010 was 87.5%, which is comparable to the average score of 87.3% for 2009, 86% for 2008 and 87% for 2007. The highest application score was 98% and the lowest score was 64%.

- Each of the 38 applications had two independent reviewers and 1 had three independent reviewers. Scores were averaged for a final score.
- Out of 38 applications, 34 received scores between 80% - 100%. Three applications received scores between 70% – 80%, and two received scores between 60% - 70%.

REMARKS:

Allen County, Belmont County and Marion County, scored between 70% - 80% to receive a 5% reduction from requested amount.

Portage and Sandusky County Health Departments scored between 60%-70% and Green County Hlth Dept application received late are to be reduced to the minimum \$30,000 amount.

Columbus Public Health (Franklin county) receives unsatisfactory answers to their WIC pilot objecties - funding will not be removed, but conditions added to complete the objective according to the RFP.

Canton City Health Dept requested more than the maximum allowed, funding reduced to funding maximum.
