**REMARKS:**

A new administrative tool was created called a "Local Level Project Plan." It was developed through a collaborative efforts of Tamara Malkoff, Senior Counsel, ODH, Office of the General Counsel and Karen Tinsley, Chief Grants Administration Unit. The development of this tool was necessitated by the way the Federal Application was drafted. Because ODH Program staff, SAMSHA and OU Legal staff worked together on drafting the application, the funded project required a somewhat unusual situation. It resulted in an arrangement where ODH and SAMSHA will jointly administer the Project LAUNCH and OU is the fiscal agent. The grant recipient was named in the Notice of Award so there no need to post the RFP using GMIS; instead the RFP was sent to OU via e-mail. Once the award is made payment will be made via GMIS.
