OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

INITIATIVE 1: Provision of support and technical assistance to Ohio's hospitals for the implementation of the statewide patient tracking system, OHTrac.

INITIATIVE 2: Development of a Disaster Exercise Guidebook to assist Ohio's hospital in implementing an emergency preparedness exercise program for various mass casualty events and an influenza outbreak. The Disaster Exercise Guidebook will assist hospitals in meeting accreditation and regulatory requirements as well as HSEEP requirements.

INITIATIVE 3: Development of a medical control plan that defines medical control for the state and would provide a template for implementation at the local and regional level for coordination with the local and state EOC. The plan must include recommendations for the control of patient movement and resources during a disaster within a tiered framework. The plan must be developed through the use of focus groups consisting of stakeholders from across various disciplines involved in coordinating preparedness and response efforts at the regional and state level.

INITIATIVE 4: Maintenance of the statewide "PrepareOhio.com" healthcare disaster preparedness website.

INITIATIVE 5: Continued assistance with standard statewide definitions of levels of surge and coordination for Ohio's hospitals.

INITIATIVE 6: System administration of the designated statewide bed tracking system, Surgenet, to ensure continued compliance with the most current HAvBED standards

INITIATIVE 7: Further development and implementation of the resource tool and permission system component of the statewide patient tracking system into each of Ohio's seven Homeland Security regions.
