OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

The purpose of the STD Prevention program is to enhance the prevention and control of STDs by supporting and improving the capacity of local public health districts to (1) design, implement, and evaluate Comprehensive STD Prevention Systems (CSPS); (2) implement the Syphilis Elimination Effort (SEE) in designated high morbidity areas (HMAs) to enhance activities to prevent, control and eliminate syphilis; and (3) implement the Gonococcal Isolate Surveillance Project (GISP) in eligible jurisdictions. Grantees implementing programs must primarily focus their efforts on the prevention of chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis among disproportionately impacted populations.

Regional coverage as defined by the HIV/STD/AVH Prevention Program must be provided for CSPS. Depending on which applicants are approved, geographical areas for Disease Intervention Specialist (DIS) services will be maintained or redefined for appropriate coverage. Applicants must define proposed coverage area and must stipulate the ability to adjust coverage area as defined by needs of the ODH HIV/STD/AVH Prevention Program.

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

This is a competitive grant year; contents of applications were reviewed based upon the quality of planned interventions in response to the Request for Proposal guidelines. The application was reviewed and scored by three independent reviewers with the possibility of 81 points for the CSPS applicants, 60 points for SEE applicants and 15 points for GISP.

REMARKS:

Federal Funding: \$970,423
 STD Prevention Program adopted the HIV Care Ryan White Consortia Map for Disease Intervention Specialist (DIS) coverage. A DIS Funding Formula was used to determine the number of DIS that could be funded for each region. The DIS are funded from both the STD Prevention and HIV Prevention grants. In 2009, the STD and HIV Prevention Programs funded 25 DIS; in 2010, the Programs will fund 22 DIS.

Dayton & Montgomery County applied for \$110,720. Based on the funding formula and revised coverage area, Dayton will only require 2 DIS to cover the Dayton service area. Currently, Dayton funds 2 DIS from the STD Prevention grant and 1 DIS from the HIV Prevention grant. Program has reduced their STD grant award from \$110,720 to \$37,799. This new funding allocation will fund 1 DIS from the STD Prevention grant with a 30% disease incidence rate.

Youngstown City Health District applied for \$41,141. Based on the DIS funding formula and revised coverage area, only 1 DIS is required to cover the Youngstown service area. Currently, Youngstown funds 1 DIS from the STD Prevention grant and 1 DIS from the HIV Prevention grant. Program has reduced their STD grant award from \$41,141 to \$30,000. This new funding allocation will fund 1 DIS between the STD Prevention and HIV prevention grants.

Cleveland City, Columbus City, Portsmouth City and Akron City applied for more funding than was available but these agencies are receiving a larger award than in 2009. Cincinnati City did not include the \$3,000 for GISP funding in which they are to be awarded.
