



HIV Care Services' Programs

Case Management Program

This program helps people access HIV-related medical services.

Ohio HIV Drug Assistance Program (OHDAP)

Provides HIV medications to eligible clients.

Health Insurance Premium Payment (HIPP) Program

Provides payment assistance for health insurance premiums and/or medication co-pays (including those with Medicare Part D) for eligible clients.

Community Linkage Coordination (CLC) Program

Community linkage coordinators link inmates (within 120 days of release from prison) with case management and medical services.



What is an HIV case manager?

HIV case managers are licensed social workers who have been trained in HIV/AIDS services. They can help you get the things you need, such as:

- Medical care
 - Medication
 - Mental health
 - Other HIV-related services
- 

A case manager can also help you with HIV-related emergencies.

There is no charge for case management.

What is the Ryan White program?

Ryan White is a federal government program that gives money to each state to help people with HIV/AIDS.

Who can get help from Ohio's Ryan White program?

To receive assistance, you need to:

- ✓ Live in Ohio
- ✓ Be HIV positive [+]
- ✓ Meet program's income guidelines

What is Emergency Financial Assistance?

Emergency Financial Assistance provides funds that your case manager can use to help you pay for HIV-related emergencies. These include:

- Doctor visits
 - HIV-related diagnostic tests
 - Medication
 - Oral health services
