Smiles for Ohio—Fluoride Varnish: Training for Primary Medical Care Providers Serving Young Children Enrolled in Medicaid

The Ohio Department of Health's (ODH's) Oral Health program and the National Maternal and Child Oral Health Resource Center, Georgetown University are proud to announce a self-study course available for primary medical care providers interested in improving the oral health of young children enrolled in Medicaid. The course was adapted with permission from *Maryland's Mouths Matter*, a curriculum developed by the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. This course is designed to provide Medicaid/Healthchek primary medical care providers and other health care providers with knowledge needed to reduce the incidence of dental caries among children under age 6 and to contribute to the establishment of a dental home.

Smiles for Ohio—Fluoride Varnish: Training for Primary Medical Care Providers Serving Young Children Enrolled in Medicaid, is a free, 1-hour, web-based course that consists of four modules:

- Module 1: The Role of Primary Medical Care Providers
- Module 2: Dental Caries Process
- Module 3: Caries Risk Assessment
- Module 4: Anticipatory Guidance, Fluoride Varnish and Referral
