

Spring Viremia of Carp

DISEASE IN ANIMALS

Spring viremia of carp is caused by a rhabdovirus and is mainly seen in farmed carp. Mortality rates in young fish approach 90 percent. The virus is spread by fomites and parasitic invertebrates making it difficult to eradicate.
