Accordingly, it has been determined that the condition existing at this project constitutes an emergency requiring immediate action to protect the public health and safety. Therefore, under the authority of R.C. 3710.13 and Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.) 3701-34-03(I), I hereby order that you **immediately** comply with the following marked item(s):

- Cease all asbestos hazard abatement activities at this location.
- Restrict access to _____
- Complete the asbestos removal indicated on the Prior Notification of Asbestos Hazard Abatement Project form submitted for this project.
- Obtain the services of an independent third party asbestos consultant, who is certified as an Asbestos Hazard Evaluation Specialist, to perform a visual inspection upon completion of the removal and decontamination activities and prior to area deregulation.
- Obtain the services of an independent third party asbestos consultant, who is certified as an Asbestos Hazard Evaluation Specialist, to perform clearance air-sampling upon completion of the removal and decontamination activities and prior to area deregulation.
- Procure clearance air-samples to be analyzed by Transmission Electron Microscopy (TEM) in accordance with O.A.C. 3701-34.
- Procure clearance air-samples to be analyzed by Phase Contrast Microscopy (PCM) in accordance with O.A.C. 3701-34.

- Notify the Ohio Department of Health Asbestos Program for:
 - a final inspection **after** passing clearance air-sampling and prior to area deregulation.
 - a final inspection prior to area deregulation.
- Forward a copy of the final air clearance results to the Ohio Department of Health Asbestos Program prior to the final inspection.

All inspections, abatement activities and air monitoring must be performed by Ohio Department of Health certified individuals and licensed companies in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local asbestos regulations.

This order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect unless revoked or modified by the Director of Health.

Pursuant to R.C. section 3710.13(B) and O.A.C. 3701-34-03(I), the Director of the Ohio Department of Health (“Director”), without notice or hearing, may issue an order requiring any action necessary to meet a public health emergency involving asbestos. Any person to whom an order is directed shall immediately comply with the order.

HEARING PROCEDURES

Pursuant to the R.C. Chapter 119 and R.C. section 3710.13, you have the right to request a hearing to contest this Order. Your request must be in writing, and must be made within **ten** days of the date of this order. Your request for a hearing should be directed to Kaye Norton, Office of General Counsel, Ohio Department of Health, 246 North High Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215. The Director shall set the hearing no later than twenty days after the director receives your request for hearing.

Hearings are conducted by impartial hearing officers. At a hearing you may appear in person, you may be represented by your attorney, or you may present your position, arguments or contentions in writing. You may also present evidence and examine witnesses appearing for or against you.
