**OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:**

The goal of the IAP program is to achieve and maintain 90% vaccination coverage levels for universally recommended vaccines among children less than 24 months of age through:

- Assessing and improving health district immunization rates through use of local Immunization Information System (IIS)
- Assessing and improving the immunization rates of providers throughout the applicant county (or counties)
- Increasing the percentage of children participating in the state or local Immunization Information System (IIS)
- Identifying geographic pockets of low immunization levels and providing additional immunization education to parents and health care providers in those areas
- Educating immunization providers and other providers who provide primary care to children
- Collaborating with WIC
- Implementing additional and targeted reminder and recall activities to improve local health department immunization rates.

**REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:**

The 2008 Immunization Action Plan grant application is a competitive grant application beginning January 1, 2008 and ending December 31, 2008. ODH received 48 completed IAP grant applications through GMIS 2.0 for 2008. Of those, 13 IAP applications represent multi-county partnerships with a total number of counties applying for funds equaling 61. As a comparison, there were 62 total counties that applied for IAP funds in 2007. The Greene County Combined Health District submitted a request to resubmit their application because it was not submitted properly. The GAPP Compliance Committee granted permission to resubmit this application.

According to the RFP, 2008 IAP Awards will be based upon all of the following criteria:

1. The resident birth cohort of children in the applicant county;
2. The number of VFC providers in each applicant county;
3. The ability of applicants to meet stated program objectives in 2006 and 2007 (if applicable);
4. The soundness and score of applicant responses to requirements for 2008.

All 2008 IAP applications were scored by two independent reviewers from the Immunization Program workforce. The average IAP application score for 2008 was 86%, which is comparable to the average score of 88% for 2007 and 87% for 2006. The highest average score was 99% and the lowest score was 57%.

**REMARKS:**

The amount of state GRF funding to be used is \$700,000.

2008 IAP applicants with scores over 80% are generally funded according to their request or maximum amount allowed for their county (s). Agencies with application scores between 70%-80% received a 10% reduction in funds. Agencies with scores less than 70% received a 15% reduction in funds. The minimum award was \$20,000.

Three agencies received an average score of less than 70 percent.

- Pike County Health Department – 57%
- Portage County Health Department – 62%
- Wood County Combined Health District – 62%

The Portage county application received a 15% reduction in funding because of poorer performance and application. The Pike county application was reduced to \$20,000 because the subcontractor, Ross County is not to be funded due to significant deficiencies in their IAP objectives. The Wood county application was not funded because of deficiencies in regard to significant objectives involving AFIX in the private sector and targeted MOBI education.

The following applications received scores of less than 80 percent and will receive a 10% funding reduction.

- Darke County - 77%
- Cambridge-Guernsey County Health Department - 77%
- Lorain County - 79%
- Canton City - 75%
- Vinton County - 78%

The following applications were reduced because the requested amount was greater than the maximum allowable in the RFP:

- City of Hamilton Health Department
- Lucas County Regional Health District
- Canton City Health Department
