OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

Activities include multi-faceted, community-based injury prevention programs. Programs may incorporate the following activities:
 1) Injury surveillance and/or community assessment;
 2) Education/training relative to the risks associated with injury;
 3) Enactment and enforcement of regulations and policies aimed at reducing injury risks;
 4) Engineering of solutions that decrease or eliminate the risks associated with injury;
 5) Design and implementation of environmental systems that will reduce injury risks;
 6) Evaluation of the effectiveness of measures instituted.

Programs must have 50% of one FTE devoted to injury prevention activities.

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

- 1) Applicants successfully completed all sections and complied with program guidelines and requirements as listed in the RFP;
- 2) Applicants submitted a budget appropriate with the proposed activities.
- 3) Applicants demonstrated the ability to successfully complete the proposed project and achieve the goals and objectives as written in the application for funding;
- 4) Applicants demonstrated compliance with the requirement to devote at least .5 of a full-time employee to injury prevention activities.

REMARKS:

Seneca County Health Department chose to not apply for year 5 injury prevention funding. The funding that would have been allocated to Seneca County has been divided up among 13 subgrantees. These subgrantees have all been allocated \$36,720 for year 5. The exception is Life Care Alliance (LCA) who will continue to receive \$35,000. LCA's application is approved for funding but their performance in responding to the RFP did not warrant a funding increase.

The additional allocations have been described as Comments in each of the subgrantees' applications.
