OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

The Cuyahoga County urban pandemic influenza demonstration project will explore various methodologies allowing for the distribution and dispensing of influenza antiviral medications to self-isolated or self-quarantined individuals as part of a targeted, layered community containment plan in Cuyahoga, Summit, and Hamilton counties.

The OSU Research Foundation rural pandemic influenza demonstration project focuses on mass fatality management (MFM) in the Southeast (Ross, Pike, Hocking, Vinton, and Jackson Counties) and Northwest (Williams, Henry, Fulton, Paulding, Putnam, and Defiance Counties) homeland security regions.

The Hospital Council of Northwest Ohio rural pandemic influenza demonstration project focuses on strategies to coordinate essential healthcare services. County health departments in the Northwest Ohio Homeland Security Region (Defiance, Fulton, Henry, Paulding, Putnam, Williams, and Van Wert) and the Summit County General Health District will design and establish as Rural Emergency Medical System (REMS).

The Summit County General Health District urban pandemic influenza demonstration project addresses vulnerable population needs in Summit, Franklin, Cuyahoga, and Hamilton counties. This project will assess the needs of disabled, language challenged, and elderly/pediatric populations.

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

Potential subgrantee applications were reviewed based on a set of critical elements, each of which was assigned a point total. The critical elements and their point value used to evaluate the applications were: Budget Cover Page (5 points); Budget Summary (2 points); Description of Applicant Agency and Documentation of Eligibility/Personnel (2 points); Project Abstract (3 points); Program Narrative (50 points); Program Methods (30 points); Program Personnel (15 points); Past Performance (2 points).

The point total was determined by the extent to which the application provided the required information. Points given to each of these elements was divided by the maximum points that could be received (109), resulting in a percent score.
