

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

All proposals were judged on the quality, clarity and completeness of the application. Applications were judged according to the extent to which the proposal:

1. Contributes to the advancement and/or improvement of the health of Ohioans;
2. Is responsive to policy concerns and program objectives of the initiative/program/ activity for which grant dollars are being made available;
3. Is well executed and is capable of attaining program objectives;
4. Describes specific objectives, activities, milestones and outcomes with respect to time-lines and resources;
5. Estimates reasonable cost to the Ohio Department of Health, considering the anticipated results;
6. Demonstrates that program personnel are well qualified by training and/or experience for their roles in the program and the applicant organization has adequate facilities and personnel;
7. Provides an evaluation plan, including a design for determining program success;
8. Is responsive to the special concerns and program priorities specified in the request for proposal; and,
9. Has demonstrated acceptable past performance in areas related to programmatic and financial stewardship of grant funds.
10. Has demonstrated compliance to GAPP, Chapter 100.

Applicants were also judged on whether they addressed all program components and goals.

REMARKS:

The current subgrantee for the continuation grant for Region VIII - Community Action Commission of Belmont County notified ODH that they no longer wanted the grant and did not submit an application for the continuation grant for this region. Program notified the Help Me Grow programs in the 12 counties that current RIHP subgrantee would no longer be providing services and that Program would have to go to Grants Compliance committee regarding a plan for coverage of the region. Two county HMG programs (Noble and Harrison) expressed interest in applying for the grant for coverage of the region. Harrison notified Program on 5/21/08 that Noble County was interested in applying for the grant and therefore they would not be applying unless Noble backed out. Program went to Compliance Committee in order to issue the grant to Noble County Health Department for the last year of this continuation grant for this region only. Noble County Health Department is willing to take on this grant effective July 1, 2008 in order to prevent a break in direct services for the families with children with hearing impairment in the region.

Compliance Committee and the Director approved the request. Noble County Health Department submitted a grant application and is included with this SAAN.
