OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

In accordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) HIV Prevention Projects and the HIV Prevention Plan for Ohio, the purpose of the HIV Prevention Projects Grant is to support and enhance the ability of public health agencies to design, implement, and evaluate comprehensive HIV prevention programs. A comprehensive HIV prevention program should include the following components:

- A. HIV prevention community planning;
- B. HIV prevention activities such as HIV prevention counseling, testing and referral services (CTRS), partner services (PS), prevention for HIV-infected persons, health education/risk reduction (HE/RR) activities, health communication/public information (HC/PI), and perinatal transmission prevention;
- C. Program monitoring and quality assurance;
- D. Capacity-building activities;
- E. Program collaboration and coordination with other related programs (e.g., sexually transmitted diseases (STD), adult viral hepatitis (AVH)).

The goal of this program is to reduce the transmission of HIV by building the capacity of public health agencies, community based organizations (CBOs), and other public health based organizations to:

1. Deliver targeted, sustained, and evidence-based HIV prevention interventions;
2. Implement proven public health strategies such as HIV/STD partner services (PS);
3. Develop systems and relationships to ensure clients are linked to appropriate prevention, care, and treatment services; and,
4. Develop and implement capacity-building, program monitoring and quality assurance policies and procedures.

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

The 2011 HIV Prevention Projects grant is a continuation grant application beginning January 1, 2011, and ending December 31, 2011. On October 18, 2010, the HIV Prevention Program received two statewide proposals and nine regional proposals. Applications were reviewed based upon the quality of planned interventions in response to the Request for Proposal guidelines. Each statewide grant was scored by two program staff members and each regional grant was scored by three program staff members. Scores were reviewed, compiled and averaged. Grant scores ranged from: 68 – 93 percent, with only one agency falling below 70 percent. All subgrantees will receive a site visit with the HIV prevention program manager in the first quarter of 2011. However, agencies that received a grant score between 60 – 79 percent will receive a formalized special condition to schedule and complete a site visit with the program manager.

REMARKS:

Federal: \$3,994,035 (\$75,000 from 01P, remaining from 39P)
GRF: \$180,000

In September 2011, the Ohio HIV Prevention program announced the opportunity for 11 continuation grants, totaling \$4,174,036 in federal HIV prevention funds. On October 18, 2010, the HIV Prevention Program received two statewide proposals and nine regional proposals requesting a total \$4,174,146 in HIV prevention funds. One grantee, Lucas – Toledo Combined General Health District, requested an additional \$110 in funds, and will receive a special condition to reduce to the maximum allowable amount. Each statewide grant was scored by two program staff members and each regional grant was scored by three program staff members. Scores were reviewed, compiled and averaged.

Grant scores ranged from: 68 – 93 percent. All subgrantees will receive a site visit with the HIV prevention program manager in the first quarter of 2011. However, agencies that received a grant score between 60 – 79 percent will receive a formalized special condition to schedule and complete a site visit with the program manager.
