OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

Applicants were required to provide objectives, activities, timelines and expenses on the following 4 goals:

1. Work to develop defined, measurable behavioral change in tobacco use in the selected population
2. Create awareness and understanding of the health problems tobacco use cause with a focus on defined behavioral change related to (a) tobacco health risks and (b) new tobacco products and their appeal to youth, utilizing evidence-based strategies or interventions whenever available
3. Direct tobacco users to cessation resources in their area
4. Assist ODH with administration of the Ohio YTS should a school be selected in the geographical service area of the sub-grantee

Applicants were also to choose a minimum of one of the following goals and provide the same information:

1. Work with advocates and decision makers to increase the number of public school districts serving the specified population which implements 100% tobacco free school policies by March 28, 2012
2. Implement strategies to reduce children's exposure to secondhand smoke in homes and vehicles, including awareness of related health problems (asthma, ear infections, SIDS, pneumonia, and bronchitis.)

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

Applicants were reviewed and scored based on the required information which was based on Executive Summary, Applicant Capacity, Statement of Need, Scope of Work, Evaluation and Budget. Agencies' applications were reviewed first by the epidemiologist to ensure the support data was accurate. Two agencies were not reviewed since the data provided in the application was not accurate and another for submitted an incomplete application. Two teams of 4 reviewed applications individually and then met to agree upon a consensus score. The final meeting was for approval of the 2 agencies for the final NOA.
