**OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:**

The purpose of the STD Prevention program is to enhance the prevention and control of STDs by supporting and improving the ability of local public health departments to (1) design, implement, and evaluate Comprehensive STD Prevention Systems (CSPS); (2) implement the Syphilis Elimination Effort (SEE) in designated high morbidity areas (HMAs) to enhance activities to prevent, control and eliminate syphilis; and (3) implement the Gonococcal Isolate Surveillance Project (GISP) in eligible jurisdictions. Grantees implementing these programs must primarily focus their efforts on the prevention of chlamydia, gonorrhea, and syphilis among disproportionately impacted populations.

Regional coverage as defined by the HIV/STD/AVH and TB Prevention and Control Program must be provided for CSPS. Funds will be shifted based on STD morbidity and Disease Intervention Specialist (DIS) productivity levels and workloads.



**REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:**

This is a continuation grant year; contents of applications were reviewed based upon the quality of planned interventions in response to the Request for Proposal guidelines. The application was reviewed and scored by three independent reviewers with the possibility of 92 points for the CSPS applicants, 55 points for SEE applicants and 15 points for GISP.

**REMARKS:**

Federal Funding: \$1,049,548

Columbus City Health Department applied for \$353,383. Due to the shifting of funds within the CSPS component of the STD grant, Program will award an additional \$20,000 to the Columbus City Health Department for the purpose of building their capacity for electronic lab reporting directly into the Ohio Disease Reporting System. Program has increased their STD grant award from \$353,383 to \$373,383.

Public Health – Dayton and Montgomery County applied for \$37,799. Due to the shifting of funds within the CSPS component of the STD grant, Program will award an additional \$5,000 to Public Health – Dayton and Montgomery County for the purpose of building their capacity for electronic lab reporting directly into the Ohio Disease Reporting System. Program has increased their STD grant award from \$37,799 to \$42,799.

Cincinnati City Health Department applied for \$113,932. Due to the shifting of funds within the CSPS component of the STD grant, Program will award an additional \$50,000 to the Cincinnati City Health Department for the purpose of building their capacity for a full-time Disease Intervention Specialist Supervisor who will solely manage the STD grant and STD/HIV partner services. Program has increased their STD grant award from \$113,932 to \$163,932.
