OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:

The purpose of the Save Our Sight Children's Vision Health and Safety Education Program is to ensure that children in Ohio have good vision and healthy eyes by providing vision health and safety programs and materials for traditional and non-traditional classrooms. The Save Our Sight Fund is earmarked to educate children, parents and school personnel about the benefits of early screening and regular eye exams and how to keep eyes healthy and free from injury. Applicants for the Save our Sight Children's Vision Health and Safety Education Program may apply to provide vision health and safety programs.

REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:

This was a competitive grant cycle. The review was based on the applicant's eligibility to apply, 501 (c) organization with vision service experience and the capacity to serve all Ohio counties. The scope and comprehensiveness of the proposed goals, objectives, activities, and method of program evaluation, and an approved budget were also reviewed. Successful applicant provided components as outlined in the RFP for the Save Our Sight Children's Vision Health and Safety Education Program.
