**OVERALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY FUNDS SOURCE:**

The purpose of the Save Our Sight Children's Vision Screener Training Program is to ensure that children in Ohio have good vision and healthy eyes by implementing voluntary preschool children's vision screener training and certification programs and provision of vision screening equipment. In Ohio, one in four school-aged children and one in twenty preschoolers have a vision problem. Applicants for the Save Our Sight Children's Vision Screener Training Program may apply to provide vision screener training and certification programs and provide vision screening equipment. A minimum of 20% of the total number of trained screeners must be preschool teachers, child care providers and staff, and volunteers.

**REVIEW CRITERIA USED FOR SELECTION:**

This was a competitive grant cycle. The review was based on the applicant's eligibility to apply, 501 (c) organization with vision service experience and the capacity to serve all Ohio counties. The scope and comprehensiveness of the proposed goals, objectives, activities, and method of program evaluation, and an approved budget were also reviewed. Successful applicant provided components as outlined in the RFP for the Save Our Sight Children's Vision Screener Training Program.

**REMARKS:**

This was a competitive grant application. An objective, external review panel of nine reviewers was convened in June 2011; the panel had no conflicts of interest. Each reviewer used an evaluation tool to review and score each grant proposal. The evaluation tool was provided as an attachment to the RFP. All perspective applicants had knowledge of the review criteria used.

The approved application was responsive to the RFP; the application provided an executive summary, detailed plan of action and appropriate budget with a detailed yet concise narrative.

The disapproved application was incomplete and failed to address the RFP; failed to provide a detailed plan of action; failed to explain functions of agencies detailed in the plan and the plan was not well executed and is not capable of attaining ODH program objectives; failed to justify the budget, subcontracts and partnering agency roles; cost estimates are not reasonable to ODH for the unspecified results and past performance; was not responsive to policy concerns and program objectives; and most importantly, the grant application proposal was inconsistent with the goals and purpose of the Save Our Sight Vision Screening Training Program.
