

## ODH Crosswalk for Ebola Exposure and Risk Intervention

Tier	Exposure Category	Public Health Actions
1A	<p>Any direct skin to skin or mucus membrane contact or contact with blood and body fluids without using appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)</p>	<p><b><u>Full Quarantine</u></b> Supported confinement at home or in temporary housing provided by the state</p> <p>AND</p> <p><b><u>Direct active monitoring</u></b> Twice daily temperature and symptom checks<sup>2</sup> for 21 days after departing the impacted country<sup>1</sup>, observed once and reported once by phone</p> <p>AND</p> <p><b><u>Movement restrictions</u></b> Confined to home and no commercial conveyance for 21 days after last contact</p>
1B	<p>Any health care worker (HCW) in one of the countries impacted by Ebola<sup>1</sup> who had been treating patients with the Ebola virus within 21 days, including HCWs who used PPE</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Any traveler who has been to one of the countries impacted by Ebola<sup>1</sup> within 21 days with uncertain direct contact or uncertain exposure</p>	<p><b><u>Home Confinement</u></b> Supported confinement at home</p> <p>AND</p> <p><b><u>Direct active monitoring</u></b> Twice daily temperature and symptom checks<sup>2</sup> for 21 days after departing the impacted country<sup>1</sup>, observed once and reported once by phone</p> <p>AND</p> <p><b><u>Movement restrictions</u></b> The public health authority, based on a specific assessment of the individual's situation, will determine whether additional restrictions are appropriate, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Exclusion from long-distance commercial conveyances (e.g., aircraft, ship, bus, train) or local public conveyances (e.g., bus, subway);</li> <li>• Any travel outside of the jurisdiction of the local health authority must be under mutual agreement of the health authority of jurisdiction and the public health official who will assume responsibility for daily observation;</li> <li>• Exclusion from public places and congregate gatherings;</li> <li>• Exclusion from workplaces for the duration of a public health order, unless approved by the state or local health department (telework is permitted)</li> <li>• Some non-congregate public activities while</li> </ul>

<b>2</b>	<p>No direct skin to skin or mucus membrane contact or contact with blood and body fluids but within a 3-foot radius ("risk zone") of an infected individual</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Any traveler who has been to one of the countries impacted by Ebola<sup>1</sup> within 21 days but with no direct contact or known exposure</p> <p>OR</p> <p>U.S.-based health care workers caring for symptomatic Ebola patients while wearing appropriate PPE</p>	<p><b><u>Direct active monitoring</u></b> Twice daily temperature and symptom checks<sup>2</sup>, observed once and reported once by phone, for 21 days after last contact</p> <p>AND</p> <p><b><u>Movement restrictions</u></b> The public health authority, based on a specific assessment of the individual's situation, will determine whether additional restrictions are appropriate, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Exclusion from long-distance commercial conveyances (e.g., aircraft, ship, bus, train);</li> <li>• Any travel outside of the jurisdiction of the local health authority must be under mutual agreement of the health authority of jurisdiction and the public health official who will assume responsibility for daily observation; and</li> <li>• Some restrictions on local public transit, work, and congregate activities may apply</li> </ul>
<b>3</b>	<p>Brief proximity, such as being in the same room for a brief period of time, with a person with Ebola while the person was symptomatic</p>	<p><b><u>Active monitoring</u></b> Twice daily temperature and symptom checks<sup>2</sup>, reported daily to a public health official, for 21 days after last contact</p> <p>AND</p> <p><b><u>Movement restrictions</u></b> No travel outside of the United States due to the inability to verify and act upon non-compliance with reporting requirements.</p>
	<p>No direct contact, but within broad vicinity</p>	<p><b><u>Education</u></b></p>

All individuals shall be given written notice of their exposure category and the intervention and sign acknowledgement of the notice. The notice shall also apprise the individual of their responsibility to notify any first responder they come in contact with of their exposure category and intervention.

1. As of 10/24/2014 the following countries are considered impacted by Ebola: Guinea, Liberia, Sierra Leone.
2. Symptom checks: weakness, fatigue, temperature  $\geq 100.4^{\circ}\text{F}$ , headache, malaise, abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhea, myalgias, arthralgias, rash or unexplained bleeding.

This crosswalk may be adapted as additional information becomes available regarding disease transmission, and will be reviewed for adequacy not later than December 1, 2014.
