Ohio Chapter

Step One

Increase the Supply of PCP Screening for Developmental Delays, including autism

Concerned About Development Learning Collaborative

- 108 Primary Care practices were trained between Sept 2008 – December 2010; 74% of practices see >25% Medicaid
- 935 licensed pediatricians trained out of 2173 licensed in Ohio



Step One Continued



- Increase in screening from less than 15% to between 72-90%
- In January – June 2011, 4 learning sessions held to introduce screening to PCPs; additional 115 trained
- Average % of kids who received ASQ at 9 months went from 13% to 85%
- Average % of kids who received ASQ-SE at 12 months went from 0% - 97%



Step One Continued



- Average % of kids to receive an ASQ at 18 months went from 13% to 83%
- Average % to receive MCHAT at 24 months went from 20% to 90%
- All pediatricians who participated in QI Learning Collaborative participated in program for 8 months



Step Two

Increase Resources for Who Can Evaluate and Diagnosis for Autism

Diagnostic Partnerships

- **31 counties formed community-based primary care partnerships between EI and PCP.**
- **8 month reduction in lag time for diagnosis**
- **Family satisfaction with diagnostic partnership was over 90% based on family survey**
- **270 evaluations as of June 2010, 147 diagnosed with ASD**



Step Three



***Train Future Providers to
Incorporate Today's Education into
Tomorrow's Practice***

Residency Programs

- All 7 Pediatric Residency Programs were trained;
1 Family Medicine Residency Program**



Step Four

Improve Care Collaboration

Working with Child Care Providers

- **coordination of childcare providers to implement developmental screening in Step Up to Quality Sites and enhancing communication between sites and PCP**
- **6 web-based modules conducted for HMG providers over the past year and trainings were recorded for future use by HMG**



Step Five



Public Awareness Campaign

- Multi-media campaign developed, including billboards, television, radio, print, social media conducted over 4 years.
- www.concernedaboutdevelopment.org has received over 45,000 hits in past three years.
