

1. HISTORICAL DATA

CDC made perinatal hepatitis B prevention a top priority of the Hepatitis B eradication strategy in 1990. Since 1990 the ODH PHBPP has been conducting case management for pregnant women who are hepatitis B positive and their newborns.

Prior to 1999, the highest annual number of Perinatal Hepatitis B Prevention cases ever identified in Ohio was 110. With improved methods, the number of cases identified more than tripled in 2001. Each year CDC projects the number of new cases expected to be found in each state. They expect that 90% of these cases will be found yearly. This number is based on the incidence of hepatitis B in that state.
