11. **Brief description of how I do follow-up-** Perinatal follow-ups are done through reminder mailings, personal phone calls, faxes, and emails to clients and physicians for the HBV vaccine series schedule of administration and 9 month post serology; communication via ODRS, email, phone and fax to regional LHD's is utilized as well. ODRS is a tool used for tracking potential and pregnant (+) HBsAg mothers for contact information, and laboratory history as well. Contact is made directly to physicians (OB's, PED's, & FP's) offices via phone, email, faxes, and mailings. Follow-ups are made by the LHD's by which the client resides, or moves to. Communication regarding the PHBPP case is made from state level to local level and visa-versa and from local level to clients' homes as well. All is done in efforts to eliminate the spread of the hepatitis B virus from mother to child in efforts to eradicate the disease altogether.
