The purpose of the Reproductive Health and Wellness Program in Ohio is to improve the overall health and well-being of women, men, and children by improving health care access, promoting healthy lifestyles and encouraging the establishment of a reproductive life plan.



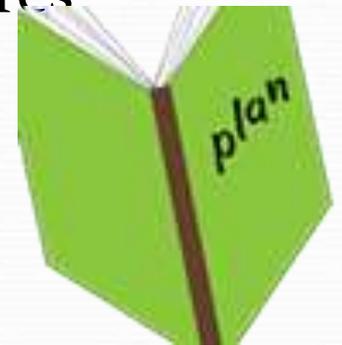
Reproductive Life Plan

- Allows individuals the opportunity to determine when and if prepared to become parents.
- Can help to lower the risks of poor health outcomes

- *Maternal and Child Health Block Grant Funds*

Other sources to sustain programs

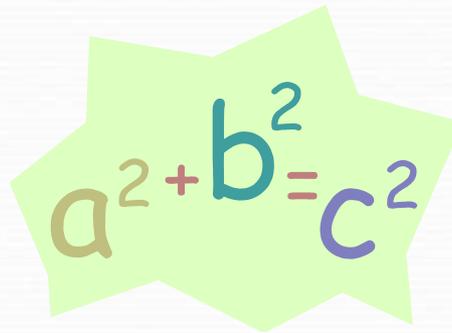
- *Project income*

Funding

- RHWP applicants must apply for a minimum of \$45,000.
- Maximum amounts listed in Appendix C
- One award per county
- Funding will be awarded in accordance with O.R.C.3701.033

Funding

- (1) the number of women aged 15 to 44 who are able to become pregnant,
- (2) the number of women aged 20 to 44 who are at less than 100% of the federal poverty line, and
- (3) the number of black or Hispanic reproductive-aged women.

Qualified Applicants

- Local public or non-profit agencies
- Attended GMIS training
- Does not owe funds to ODH
- Has not been certified AG's office.
- Has submitted application and all required attachments on time

Service Area

- Must define the specific geographic area and the specific population
- No residency requirements for eligible patients.



Service Area

If there are family planning services through a Title X direct grantee other than ODH *the applicant must CLEARLY define how their agency will be serving a different population and that there is no duplication of effort*

Need for Services

- 1.3 million women in Ohio are estimated to be in need of contraceptive services and supplies.
- About 670,000 women in Ohio may need publicly supported services.
- Publicly supported FP clinics in Ohio serve 166,260 women (25% of need)

SO... there are lots of women and men in need who are not being served!

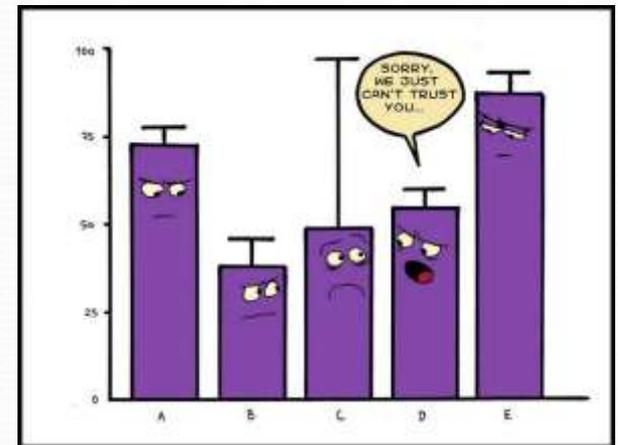

Deliverable Goal 1:

To improve the overall reproductive health and well-being of women and men.



Deliverable Objective 1

D1a: The RHWP sub grantee agency will provide comprehensive reproductive health and wellness direct health care services per nationally recognized standards of care.

D1b: The RHWP sub grantee agency will provide counseling and education to establish a reproductive life plan (RLP) to clients of child bearing status.

Deliverable Goal 2:

To improve the quality of services offered within a Reproductive Health and Wellness Program.

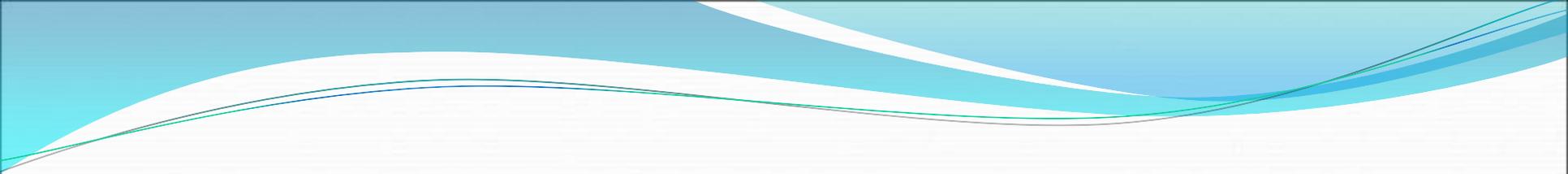


Deliverable Objective 2

D2a: The RHWP sub grantee agency will screen clients for Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs), according to current CDC guidelines.

D2b: The RHWP sub grantee agency will offer appropriate care and follow-up to clients receiving a pregnancy test.

D2c: The RHWP sub grantee agency will offer at least one type of Long Acting Reversible Contraceptive (LARC) onsite.



Base Goal 1:

To increase outreach and access for target population to a broad range of Reproductive Health and Wellness services.

Base Objective 1

B1a: The RHWP sub grantee agency will identify hard-to-reach and vulnerable populations. A targeted outreach plan will be established to increase provision of RHWP services to these groups.



B1b: The RHWP sub grantee agency will have at least 10% of scheduled appointments times available outside of normal business hours (*Monday through Friday from 9:00 am - 4:30pm*).



Base Goal 2:

To increase sustainability of
Reproductive Health and Wellness
services



Base Objective 2

B2a: The RHWP sub grantee agency will have integrated an Electronic Medical Records (EMR) system at their Health Center.

B2b: The RHWP sub grantee agency will have implemented infrastructure activities to support Program Sustainability.

B2c: The RHWP sub grantee agency will assist clients with enrollment into Medicaid and Marketplace at their Health Center.

Base Goal 3:

To enhance the services provided by the Reproductive Health and Wellness program.

Base Objective 3

(must choose one or more):

Base Objective 3

B3a: The RHWP sub grantee agency will offer RHWP services to clients who are no longer of childbearing status.

B3b: The RHWP sub grantee agency will offer rapid HIV testing method to 100% of clients.

B3c: The RHWP sub grantee agency will provide same day insertions to clients choosing LARC (if medically appropriate).

Base Objective 3

B3d: The RHWP sub grantee agency will increase the number of clients participating in evidence-based 5As preconception healthy weight program per targeted goals set in application.

B3e: The RHWP sub grantee agency will increase the number of clients being offered evidence-based 5As preconception smoking cessation program per targeted goals set in application.

Request for Proposal Guidance



Budget Narrative

Provide a DETAILED budget narrative that describes how the categorical costs are derived.

Be sure to review allowable/unallowable costs.



Budget Narrative Required Services

Deliverable Objective 1 & 2

are required and represent 80% of eligible funding.

Base Objective 1, 2, & 3

Base Objective 3 (must choose one or more)
represents 20% of eligible funding

Budget Narrative

- Complete Attachment 2 - clearly identify the services for which you are applying and the cost per strategy on the ODH Reproductive Health and Wellness Budget Overview (Attachment 2).
- These costs **must** be justified in the budget narrative.
- Reimbursements will be made monthly/quarterly

Project Narrative

1. Executive Summary

- Target population, services and programs to be offered and agency or agencies providing those services
- Public health problems to be addressed
- Total project budget and portion requested from this grant
- Project goals and measures to reach and serve priority population, including evaluation plan

Project Narrative

2. Description of Applicant/Documentation of Eligibility/Personnel

- Plans for hiring and training personnel
- Assurance that professionals are licensed
- Relationships with other partners
- Position descriptions
- Data to substantiate statements of achievements of past goals and objectives

Project Narrative

3. Problem/Need

- Local health status (morbidity/mortality) and health systems (accessibility, availability, affordability) to be addressed by the program
- Explicit description of target population experiencing a disproportionate burden of the local health status concern and plans to address this disparity
- How this project will improve the health of individuals and communities by partnering with other public health programs (e.g., WIC, CFHS, Help Me Grow)

Project Narrative

4. Methodology

- Attachment # 7 – Program Plan
- One comprehensive program plan only – multiple program plans will not be accepted
- Use the format provided in RFP
- Provide planned activities and baseline data where indicated
- Program plan for Deliverable and Base objectives must be completed by all applicants
